## **Legislative News: Two-Week Review**

• <u>HB 110</u> (Rep. Oelslager) **Operating Budget**, voted out of the Senate, 6.9.21. The bill currently contains provisions concerning automatic sealing of records associated with a Governor's unconditional pardon, IDAT fund use for specialized dockets, and clarification to recent changes to RC 2929.15. The Senate changed the **mandatory statewide TCAP** in the House version of the budget to a voluntary TCAP expanded to include not just F5s, but F4s as well. It contains language taken from SB 80, which would require a **partisan designation for judges** on the general election ballot, and it contains language to counteract the recent Supreme Court case requiring counsel for **indigent parents** losing parental rights in adoptions. A vote on HB 110 is expected Tuesday.

- <u>HB 339</u> (Rep. Swearingen) **E-Wills**, introduced 6.7.21. For estate planning documents and end of life directives, the bill allows remote witnessing by video-conference.
- HB 343 (Rep. White) Marsy's Law Implementation, introduced 6.8.21. The bill: requires that a victim and victims' representatives get all notices, motions, and court orders that are filed; entitles the victim to not testify in court regarding victim's contact or location information and to request that that information be redacted from court records; entitles a victim to be present at the post-arrest release hearing and a community control revocation hearing; requires that a victim gets notice of acquittal or conviction, including the PSI, and of judicial release or other early release; significantly expands the concept of restitution.
- <u>HB 345</u> (Reps. Crossman, Howse) **Human Impact Statement**, introduced 6.9.21. The bill requires the Legislative Service Commission to prepare a human impact statement for any bill proposed that would impact criminal law.
- <u>HB 352</u> (Reps. Crawley, Ray) **Custody of a Minor**, introduced 6.17.21. The bill prohibits a person's disability from being used to deny or limit custody, parenting time, visitation, adoption, or service as a guardian or foster caregiver.
- The beginning of the **next attorney registration biennium**, 7.1.21, often coincides with questions from judges and court administrators about using local court funds to pay for a judge's attorney registration fees. In the past, the Attorney General has issued an <u>opinion</u> you might find helpful.
- A <u>fact sheet</u> prepared by the Ohio Access to Justice Foundation is available explaining the BMV's **Driver's License Reinstatement Fee Amnesty Program**, made permanent last year in HB 285, and in effect since 9.15.20.
- Save the Date: The Ohio Judicial Conference's **Annual Meeting** is 9.2 and 9.3.21 with +10 hours of judicial education. The agenda includes presentations from Supreme Court scholar Professor Erwin Chemerinsky, forensic psychiatrist Dr. Phillip Resnick, and cyber-stalking expert Steven Bradley.
