Legislative News: Two Week Review

- Mike DeWine was sworn in as Governor of Ohio, 1.14.19. He immediately signed 6 executive orders to: 1) [create the RecoveryOhio Initiative](#); 2) create the Children's Initiative; 3) establish Ohio as a disability inclusion state; 5) re-institute previous anti-discrimination policies that had expired at midnight, adding provisions prohibiting discrimination against pregnant women, parents of young children and foster parents; and 6) [elevate prevention efforts in the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services](#).
- Legislative leadership for the 133rd General Assembly has mostly been set in the Senate: [Sen. Obhof](#) is the Senate President; [Sen. Peterson](#) is the President Pro Tempore; and [Sen. Huffman](#) is the Majority Whip. [Sen. Yuko](#) is the Minority Leader; [Sen. Thomas](#) is the Assistant Minority Leader; [Sen. O'Brien](#) is the Minority Whip; and [Sen. Williams](#) is the Assistant Minority Whip. In the House, [Rep. Householder](#) was voted in as Speaker but other leadership has not yet been decided. Minority leadership in the House is likely to change.
- **HB 511 (Rep. Lanese,) Marriage Age**, signed by the Governor 1.7.19. The bill prohibits people younger than 18 from getting married. Some exceptions are made for 17 year olds, with court permission. The bill will go into effect 90 days after being signed.
- Per **HB 336**, starting 1.31.19 until 7.31.19, a **license reinstatement fee amnesty** is in effect. To be eligible, petitioners must have completed all court-ordered sanctions related to the eligible offense other than the payment of reinstatement fees. Additionally, at least 18 months must have expired since the end of the period of the suspension ordered by the court. Please see the [BMV website](#) for more details.

Law Day underscores how law and the legal process have contributed to the freedoms that all Americans share."
