## **Legislative News: Two-Week Review**

- <u>HB 258</u> (Rep. Carruthers) **Tobacco Sales to Minors**, introduced 8.28.23. The bill increases fines for repeatedly (4 or more times) selling tobacco products to minors. Additionally, the bill authorizes applying the public nuisance law to any place in which a pattern of continuous or repeated sales of tobacco to minors occur.
- Two items have been certified by the Ohio Secretary of State to be on the ballot this fall. <u>Issue 1</u> concerns **reproductive decisions** and would change the Ohio Constitution by enacting Section 22 of Article I. Ohioans United for Reproductive Rights filed a lawsuit on 8.28.23 against the Ohio Ballot Board challenging the language that the board adopted to appear on the ballot. <u>Issue 2</u>, concerning the legalization and regulation of **adult-use marijuana**, would change the Ohio Revised Code by enacting Sec. 3780. Issue 2 is a citizen-initiated effort to change the law, which qualified for the ballot after <u>legislators failed to act on the proposal</u>.
- The Ohio Department of Correction and Rehabilitation would like to remind judges to include the Ohio Revised Code **subsections for criminal offenses** in sentencing entries. The subsections help determine earned credit eligibility and possible registration requirements. If you would like to access the <u>Uniform Sentencing Entry template</u> created by the Ohio Criminal Sentencing Commission, please contact interim director <u>Niki Hotchkiss</u>. Use of the template does not require data collection.
- U.S. Sen. Sherrod Brown joined Sen. Thom Thillis (R-NC) on legislation to reauthorize the <u>Fugitive</u> <u>Safe Surrender program</u>, which lets people with felony warrants turn themselves in at churches. The program was started in Cleveland and has spread nationwide.
- On 8.17.23, the Ohio Prosecuting Attorneys Association called on the Governor to resume executions of people sentenced to death. The OPAA is suggesting a debate on alternative methods of execution, specifically nitrogen hypoxia. As of 7.18.23, the **death penalty** has been dormant in Ohio for 5 years. SB 101 is the latest effort in the legislature to abolish the death penalty entirely.
- The federal Bureau of Justice Assistance has launched a newsletter to help inform criminal justice partners about possible **grants and other resources**. Subscribe <u>here</u>.
- **Did you know?** Most of the content on <u>OhioLegalHelp.org</u>, including information on housing, family law, consumer matters, public benefits, domestic violence and the sealing of criminal records, has been <u>translated into Spanish</u>, ensuring the state's Spanish-speaking population has equitable access to information about the civil justice system.
