## **Legislative News: Two-Week Review**

- <u>SB 68</u> (Sen. Williams) **Prohibiting Questions about Felony Record**, introduced 2.17.21. The bill would prohibit employers from asking prospective employees about past felonies.
- <u>SB 80</u> (Sens. Cirino, Gavarone) **Judicial Elections**, introduced 2.24.21. The bill requires a candidate for the Ohio Supreme Court or a court of appeals who was nominated at a primary election to appear on the ballot at the general election with a political party designation. See also HB 149.
- <u>HB 108</u> (Rep. Galonski) **Parental Rights Over Deceased Adult Child**, introduced 2.17.21. The bill, for purposes of the right of disposition over an adult deceased child, gives precedence to a parent who was the residential parent and legal guardian over a parent that was not.
- <u>HB 109</u> (Reps. Abrams, Carruthers) **Increase in Penalty for Riot Offenses**, introduced 2.17.21. The bill increases penalties for assault, vandalism, and riot; it allows peace officers to bring civil suits against people participating in a riot, and it prohibits bias-motivated intimidation of first responders.
- HB 110 (Rep. Oelslager) Biennial Budget, introduced 2.17.21. The bill impacts policy by including: requiring courts to file all protection orders with NCIC within 7 days; increasing penalties for weapons under disability, for illegally transferring a firearm, and for selling a firearm to a minor and increasing sentence lengths for gun specifications; capping community control terms at 1 year for an F5, 3 years for an F4, and 5 years for an F1 and similarly capping PRC terms; requiring courts to notify the AG of all cases where the defendant is found NGRI or incompetent to stand trial and also of discharge or final termination in those cases; and making record-sealing by a judge automatic if the Governor issues an unconditional pardon.
- <u>HB 111</u> (Rep. Lightbody) **Cell Phones and Driving**, introduced 2.17.21. The bill expands the current prohibition against texting while driving by also prohibiting using phone apps or games.
- <u>HB 121</u> (Reps. Boggs, Lanese) **Eliminating Spousal Exception to Rape**, introduced 2.17.21. The bill eliminates the spousal exception to rape (and sexual battery, sexual imposition, and unlawful sexual conduct with a minor) of someone who is or has been impaired. It also allows a person to testify against that person's spouse.
- On 2.12.21, the Ohio Board of Professional Conduct issued <u>advisory opinion 2021-01</u>, which prohibits a judge from serving as a member or officer of the board of directors of a nonprofit corporation that provides services to the court under a contract with the court's funding authority.
- On 1.20.21, the **CDC's eviction moratorium** was extended until 3.31.21. **Federal funding is available** in aid to tenants. Information about applying is online.
- In response to the recent decision by the Ohio Supreme Court, <u>2020- Ohio-6785</u>, the <u>Ohio Public Defender will immediately begin to accept</u>, for purposes of reimbursement, the indigent defense costs in cases where a parent is facing a **termination of parental rights in probate court**.
- The deadline for the Supreme Court's <u>Technology Initiative Grants</u> is 3.5.21.
