- 3. by U.S. Postal Service to Mahoning County Probate Court, 120 Market Street, First Judge Robert N. Rusu, Jr. Floor, Youngstown, Ohio 44503.

The only documents that the Court will not allow to be filed via facsimile or email is an *Application to Probate Will (SPF 2.0)* and the original Last Will and Testament in a new estate administration. Further, all pleadings filed by facsimile or via email shall be considered original pleadings.

Further, the Court will consider, upon written request, that any upcoming hearing be held telephonically. The decision as to which hearings may be conducted telephonically, shall remain in the sole discretion of the *Mahoning County Probate Court*. Any party requesting to attend a hearing telephonically shall file a written request via facsimile, email or *U.S. Postal Service* as listed above.

The Court strongly encourages requests for continuances in situations of any health concern. Please do not hesitate to bring any concerns or questions about a particular matter or situation to the attention of the appropriate Court staff, including determining whether a personal
