## Legislative News: Two-Week Review

- <u>SB 354</u> (Sen. Blessing) **Foreclosures**, introduced 7.14.22. The bill would alter who is eligible to bid in a foreclosure sale and to create the Ohio Housing Study Committee.
- The Ohio Supreme Court is accepting public comment on a proposed <u>webform</u> to inquire about **case status and delays** in court cases. Comments on the proposal should be submitted to <u>casemgmt@sc.ohio.gov</u> by 8.12.22.
- New <u>Rules of Practice and Procedure</u> took effect 7.1.22. Among the changes is a requirement that courts provide for case filing by electronic means. <u>SCR 16</u> recently disapproved a number of proposed Rules, mainly recommendations of the iCourt Task Force, that would have codified the use of remote proceedings in certain circumstances.
- New <u>Rules of Superintendence</u> took effect 7.122, among them amendments to Rule 66 regarding ward visitation and elder abuse education.
- The Ohio Supreme Court heard 7 cases this week, including: In *State v. Fisk*, a county prosecutor argued that Marsy's Law allows the state to **appeal on behalf of an alleged victim**; in *State v. Morris* the issue is whether a trial judge must explain on the record **how age was factored into a sentence** handed down to a juvenile offender; in *State v. Bailey*, a man sentenced to up to 46.5 years for rape, robbery, and kidnapping claims that his sentence should be shorter because the rape and kidnapping charges should have been **merged for sentencing**; in *State v. Ashcraft*, a man who pleaded guilty to failure to register as a sex offender and was sentenced under two different statutes argues he **cannot be sentenced under both**; In *re Adoption of H.P.*, a father who registered with the **Putative Father Registry** 17 days after his child was born maintains its rules do not apply if the biological father establishes paternity prior to a probate court hearing.
- •The Office of Criminal Justice Services is accepting grant applications for the \$10 million Ohio Court Backlog Reduction Program. HB 169 recently dedicated \$250 million in American Rescue Plan Act funding to first responders, and that money is meant to support "every aspect of our criminal justice system," according to a statement from the Governor's office, including courts.
- The OSBA is sponsoring a virtual educational opportunity on 7.21.22 at 1pm on limited scope representation or unbundled legal services, so judges know when to accept an attorney appearing on a limited basis and understand the rules governing the use of limited scope representation. The webcast is accredited for 1.0 hour of CLE Professional Conduct credit.
- Save the Date: the Ohio Judicial Conference's Annual Meeting takes place 9.15.22 and 9.16.22. This year's theme is "Envision this World: A Modern Judiciary." Join us for a U.S. constitutional law update and for discussions on judicial wellness and stress management; eWarrant implementation; medical marijuana; active shooters; and high-tech stalking of domestic violence victims.
