In view of the continuing COVID-19 pandemic and pursuant to this Court's Temporary Emergency Order of March 19, 2020 (20-COVID19-01), the Court makes the following Emergency Orders concerning Municipal Court proceedings:

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2020 the Governor of the State of Ohio announced certain COVID-19 Responsible Protocols for Businesses, including General Office Environments; and

WHEREAS, in the interests of public health and the awareness of public expectations;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, effective May 4, 2020:

All persons entering the Clark County Offices and Municipal Court Building must wear a face covering. Persons shall wear their face covering at all times while within the public areas of the Building, including courtrooms.

While within the Clark County Offices and Municipal Court Building, all persons shall honor and abide by social distancing guidelines which generally recommend maintaining a distance of six (6) feet or more from others.

Only persons with official business will be permitted to enter the Clark County Offices and Municipal Court Building. This includes parties in a court case, subpoenaed witnesses, crime victims, summoned jurors, attorneys, and other persons conducting official business with the offices of the Clark County Commission, Clark County Probate Court, Clark County Clerk of Court Title Division, Clark County Prosecuting Attorney, Clark County Public Defender, City of Springfield Prosecutor, Clerk of the Clark County Municipal Court, and the Probation Department of the Clark County Municipal Court.

Persons who do not have official business to conduct with any of the aforementioned offices should not come to the Building, and they may have their access to the Building restricted during the public health emergency.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any person entering the Clark County Offices and Municipal Court Building will be subject to health care screening or non-invasive

testing (taking of body temperature using a touch-free thermometer), and exclusion from admission based upon the results of such screening or testing.
