Legislative News: Two-Week Review

- HB 199 (Sen. Blessing) Guardianship Bill, amended in committee and voted out of the House, 12.1.22. The bill: alters the Slayer statute (prohibiting persons from benefiting by the death of another) to address situations of murder-suicide; modernizes the Guardianship Law (language from HB 488); changes the transfer of a decedent's vehicle or watercraft at public auction; authorizes Medicaid prior authorization requirements for drugs used for medication-assisted treatment; expands the law regarding involuntary treatment for mentally ill persons subject to a court order to include psychiatric deterioration (language from HB 439); modifies the qualifications for office for judges of municipal courts, county courts, courts of common pleas, courts of appeals, and justices of the Supreme Court; permits a public children services agency or private child placing agency to accept the voluntary permanent surrender of a child in the agency's temporary custody; and enacts the Scout's Honor Law to eliminate the limitations period for a civil action based on a claim of childhood sexual abuse only for purposes of filing claims against a bankruptcy estate.
- <u>SB 210</u> (Sen. Gavarone) **Post-Nuptial Agreements**, amended in committee and voted out of the House, 12.1.22. The bill regulates agreements affecting legal relations between spouses; domestic violence protection orders in a dating relationship; and courts maintaining Social Security numbers of parties in divorce, dissolution, annulment, or spousal support proceedings. The bill also removes the population limit and in-territory residency preference for appointing acting judges.
- SB 288 (Sen. Manning) Criminal Justice Omnibus, amended in committee and voted out of the Senate, 11.29.22. Amendments to SB 288 made several changes, including: extending the amount of time a person has to wait before that person is eligible to request criminal records be expunged; creating the stand-alone offense of strangulation and adding strangulation to the definition of "offense of violence"; eliminating the statutes of limitation for attempt, conspiracy to or complicity in murder or agg murder (in response to State v. Bortree); making the ODRC-initiated judicial release process created in the as-introduced version of SB 288 more similar to the 80% release mechanism that exists in current law; narrowing eligibility for the "state-of-emergency" judicial release created in the as-introduced version of SB 288; narrowing eligibility to seal F3 records by capping to only one offense of that level (the as-introduced version of SB 288 would have expanded criminal record-sealing of F3 offenses without any cap); expanding the ability of APA officers to search a person on conditional pardon or parole, transitional control, other release from prison, or post-release control; and extending the length of the waiting period for expunging (not sealing) criminal records 3 years for misdemeanor offenses and 10 years for felony offenses.
- <u>HB 699</u> (Reps. Galonski, Seitz) Criminal Justice Omnibus, substitute bill accepted, 12.1.22. A substitute bill was accepted that would make this bill identical to <u>SB 288</u>.
