## Legislative News: Two-Week Review

- <u>HB 34</u> (Reps. King, Klopfenstein) **Breast-Feeding Juror Exemption**, voted off the Senate floor, 4.10.24. The bill creates an exemption from jury duty for anyone with an affidavit averring breast-feeding of a baby up to a year old. Despite repeated requests to improve this bill to address accommodations for all potential jurors, the bill will be soon sent to the Governor for signature.
- <u>HB 478</u> (Reps. Edwards, LaRe) **Expedited Removal of Unauthorized Occupants**, introduced 4.8.24. Under the bill, a record owner of real property (or the record owner's authorized agent) may request the county sheriff to immediately remove a person who unlawfully occupies a residential premises on that real property. The bill also prohibits the use and sale of fraudulent deeds. <u>HB 480</u> (Reps. Demetriou, Young), also introduced 4.8.24, is similar but contains an emergency clause.
- <u>HB 486</u> (Reps. Brent, Carruthers) **Aisha's Law**, introduced 4.11.24. Under the bill, a law enforcement officer, on behalf of a victim of domestic violence, may request an emergency protection order from a judicial officer during any period of time that the court is not open for regular business.
- In <u>State v. Carter</u>, (Slip Opinion No. 2024-Ohio-1247), decided 4.4.24, the Ohio Supreme Court upheld a conviction, but found that some of the evidence was unconstitutionally admitted. Eli Carter's **constitutional right to confront witnesses** against him had been violated when the trial court allowed his former boss to testify remotely from Minnesota during the 2022 trial.
- In <u>Estate of Tomlinson v. Mega Pool Warehouse, Inc.</u>, (Slip Opinion No. 2024-Ohio-1065), decided 3.26.24, the Ohio Supreme Court ruled that under Civ.R. 38(D), a party **may not unilaterally withdraw a jury demand**. Once a party in a civil case requests a jury trial, the request cannot be withdrawn unless all the parties agree, even if required jury deposits have not been paid.
- The Ohio Attorney General announces \$2.45 million in funding available to courts to help improve the completeness of the **state's criminal records database**. Funding has been allocated in 3 parts: \$1.2 million for LiveScan devices (digital fingerprint capturing machines); \$750,000 for juvenile courts or clerks of courts to electronically report adjudication information; and \$500,000 for common pleas, municipal, or county courts and clerks of courts to defray the cost of recovering case dispositions not previously reported to BCI. The deadline to apply for the grants is 5.15.24.
- The Ohio Jury Management Association's 25th Annual Conference is scheduled for 4.26.24. Topics include artificial intelligence, juror excuses, and juror forms. One of the courses, **Jury Management Process Improvement**, is approved for 4 CLE. - On 5.2.24, the Ohio State Bar Foundation is holding a symposium on **trauma informed lawyering** at the Ohio Statehouse, covering topics like the impact of trauma, red flags of a trauma response, how to deal with individuals that have experienced trauma in the courtroom and more.
