Legislative News: Two Week Review

- HB 1 (Reps. Manning, Sykes) Dating Violence, voted out of House Civil Justice Committee, 2.22.17. Passed out of the House, 2.28.17
- SB 63 (Sen. Thomas) Confinement Credit introduced 2.22.17. The bill defines
 "confinement" of a juvenile to include locked and secure facilities (or locked and
 secure sections), and community corrections facilities.
- <u>HB 64</u> (Rep. Schuring) **Mistaken Identity Expungement** introduced 2.21.17. The bill creates a process for expunging criminal records of a mistaken identity arrest.
- <u>SB 64</u> (Sen. Thomas) Juvenile Mandatory Bindover introduced 2.22.17. The bill
 eliminates mandatory bindover of juveniles, alters factors for discretionary bindover,
 and provides that a child found not amenable may appeal that decision immediately.
- <u>SB 66</u> (Sens. Eklund, Tavares) **Community Corrections** introduced 2.22.17. The bill removes the 1-year minimum for F4 or F5 community control sanctions, modifies calculation of confinement credits, and modifies ILC and record-sealing eligibility.
- <u>HB 67</u> (Rep. Young) **Cognovit Notes** introduced 2.15.17. The bill prohibits confessions of judgment except when settling a dispute.
- <u>SB 67</u> (Sens. Gardner, Hite) **Violent Offender Registry** introduced 2.22.17. The bill requires the attorney general to create and maintain a registry of violent offenders.
- <u>SB 70</u> (Sen. Coley) **Child Support** introduced 2.22.17. The bill makes technical changes to child support procedures.
- HB 81 (Reps. Antonio, Seitz) **Death Penalty** introduced 2.22.17. The bill prohibits the death penalty if the offender suffered a mental illness at the time of the crime.
- <u>HB 92</u> (Rep. Schaffer) **Public Indecency** introduced 2.27.17. The bill requires registration as a sex offender if found guilty of public indecency in front of a minor.
- <u>HB 95</u> (Reps. Hughes, Seitz) **Distracted Driving** introduced 2.27.17. The bill creates
 an additional penalty for distracted driving and clarifies that certain electronic device
 violations are allied offenses of similar import.
- <u>HB 96</u> (Rep. Hughes) **Sexual Imposition** introduced 2.27.17. The bill increases the penalty for repeat offenses of sexual imposition and repeals the corroboration requirement for a sexual imposition conviction.
- <u>HB 97</u> (Reps. Boggs, Johnson) **Marital Rape** introduced 2.27.17. The bill eliminates a spousal exception for rape, sexual battery, sexual imposition, and other sex offenses.
