H.B. 147 Patmon, Wachtmann	Mastectomy Guidance	To require a surgeon performing a mastectomy, lymph node dissection, or lumpectomy in a hospital to guide the patient and provide referrals in accordance with the standards of the National Accreditation Program for Breast Centers and to name this act the "Lizzie B. Byrd Act."	No impact	
H.B. 148 Driehaus	Brine Injections	To prohibit land application and deep well injection of brine, to prohibit the conversion of wells, and to eliminate the injection fee that is levied under the Oil and Gas Law.	No impact	
H.B. 149 Anielski	Suicide Prevention	To designate September 10 as "Ohio Suicide Prevention Day."	No impact	
H.B. 150 Gonzales	Rehabilitation Services	To replace the Rehabilitation Services Commission with the Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities Agency, to require the Governor to appoint the Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities Commission within the Agency, to revise definitions in the law governing the Agency, and to make related organizational changes. H.B. 151 Roegner	Right to Work	To prohibit any requirement that employees of private employers join or pay dues to any employee organization and to establish civil and criminal penalties against employers who violate that prohibition.	No impact	
H.B. 152 Maag	Right to Work	To remove any requirement under the Public Employees Collective Bargaining Law that public employees join or pay dues to any employee organization and to prohibit public employers from requiring public employees to join or pay dues to any employee organization. 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H.B. 154 Gerberry	Education Funding	To require that a portion of lottery profits be distributed annually on a per pupil basis to public and chartered nonpublic schools.	No impact	
H.B. 155 Ramos, Reece	Immigrant Driver Licenses	To allow a person who has been approved for the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program by United States Citizenship and Immigration Services to obtain a temporary instruction permit, driver's license, or motorcycle operator's license or endorsement and to amend the versions of sections 4507.05 and 4507.06 of the Revised Code that are scheduled to take effect January 1, 2017, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date. H.B. 156 Reece	Delinquent Children	To require restraints to be removed from an alleged or adjudicated delinquent child prior to the commencement of a juvenile court hearing or proceeding unless the court determines that the use of restraints is necessary to prevent physical harm to the child or another person or to prevent the child from escaping. H.B. 157 Staubert	Township Officers	To establish a procedure to recall an elective township officer.	No impact	
H.B. 158 Brenner, Patmon	School Donations	To authorize nonrefundable tax credits for donations to nonprofit entities providing scholarships to low-income students enrolling in nonpublic schools.	No impact	
H.B. 159 Hackett, Schuring	Dental Services	To prohibit a health insurer from establishing a fee schedule for dental providers for services that are not covered by any contract or participating provider agreement between the health insurer and the dental provider.	No impact	
H.B. 160 Hagan	Firearms Surrender	To require a person who is subject to a civil or criminal domestic violence temporary protection order to surrender all firearms in the person's immediate possession or control to a law enforcement agency or to a federally licensed firearms dealer. S.B. 117 Smith	Medicaid	To permit the Medicaid program to cover the eligibility expansion group authorized by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and to make an appropriation.	No impact	
S.B. 118 Tavares	Telemedicine	Regarding insurance and Medicaid coverage of telemedicine services.	No impact	
S.B. 119 Tavares	Minimum Wage	To require that domestic workers be paid the minimum wage, as provided in Section 34a of Article II, Ohio Constitution, to require that domestic workers be paid overtime wages, to make certain conduct directed toward a domestic worker an unlawful discriminatory practice, and to require a weekly day of rest for domestic workers.	No impact	
S.B. 120 Kearney	Tax Credits	To increase the total amount of credits that may be awarded under the Technology Investment Tax Credit Program from \$45 to \$145 million.	No impact	

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S.B. 121 Hughes, LaRose	Firearm Specification	To amend sections and enact sections of the Revised Code to double the mandatory prison term for an offender who is convicted of a firearm specification and previously has been convicted of a firearm specification; to similarly double the period of authorized or mandatory commitment to the Department of Youth Services of a delinquent child who is guilty of a firearm specification and previously has been adjudicated a delinquent child for committing an act that would constitute a violation of a firearm specification if committed by an adult; to prohibit violent career criminals from knowingly acquiring, having, carrying, or using any firearm or dangerous ordnance; and to require a mandatory prison term for a violent career criminal convicted of committing a violent felony offense while armed with a firearm. S.B. 122 Sawyer	Education Office	To create the Office of Regional Services and Accountability in the Department of Education.	No impact	
S.B. 123 Sawyer	Open Enrollment	To require a study of interdistrict open enrollment, and to amend sections and to repeal sections of the Revised Code effective July 1, 2015, to terminate interdistrict open enrollment on that date with the possibility of renewal following the General Assembly's examination of the study's findings. S.B. 124 Patton	Military Transportation	To require the Director of Veterans Services, upon application by a person who is a veteran or active duty member of any branch of the armed forces of the United States, to issue to the person a military transportation card that entitles the person to travel on any type of public transportation without charge.
