Legislative News: Two-Week Review

- <u>SB 252</u> (Sen. Lang) **Asbestos Litigation**, introduced 10.5.21. The bill requires a plaintiff in an asbestos tort to file a sworn statement detailing the alleged exposure(s) and requires the court to dismiss a claim when the plaintiff fails to comply.
- <u>SB 254</u> (Sens. Fedor, Maharath) **Foster Youth Bill of Rights**, introduced 10.19.21. The bill enumerates 31 rights of every child in foster care.
- <u>HB 441</u> (Reps. Cutrona, Wiggim) **Social Media De-Platforming**, introduced 10.6.21. The bill allows a person to file a civil action against a social media platform or interactive computer service alleging unlawful censorship.
- HB 459 (Reps. Cutrona, LaRe) **Sex Offenders**, introduced 10.19.21. The bill would prohibit offenders of child-oriented offenses or of sex offenses where the victim was younger than 18 from being employers, employees, or independent contractors, or volunteers in any capacity affording extensive contact with minor children. The bill provides that law enforcement must alert a prosecuting authority to known violations of the prohibition and the prosecuting authority can seek injunctive relief.
- The Ohio Public Defender published a <u>memo</u> updating the status of **indigent defense reimbursement**. The OPD's best estimate is the reimbursement rate for FY23 will be at or above 95%. - Recently, the OJC worked with the Supreme Court to host a Court Café presentation about the recently enacted <u>SB 2</u>, which impacts determinations of and restorations to competency to stand trial. The presentation was recorded and can be viewed <u>online</u>.
- The Rules Commission published <u>proposed Rule changes</u>, and the iCourt Task Force <u>recommended</u> <u>changes to the Rules of Superintendence</u>. Public Comment is open till 11.4.21.
- The <u>Home Relief Program</u> is still available to help avoid **evictions** for nonpayment of rent. Ohioans can receive assistance with rent, mortgage, or utilities from the state of Ohio, through their local <u>Community Action Agency</u>.
- The Ohio Judicial Conference has prepared a <u>criminal offense list</u> that contains information about every criminal offense in the Ohio Revised Code; it is a work in progress.
