Legislative News: Two-Week Review

• <u>SB 377</u> (Sens. Manning, Sykes) **Transitional Control Veto**, introduced 11.10.20. The bill abolishes a judge's veto over a transitional control transfer.

• <u>SB 378</u> (Sen. Hoagland) Jefferson County Court, introduced 11.10.20. The bill includes Cross

Creek Township as one of the locations where the county court in Jefferson County holds court. • <u>HB 784</u> (Reps. Abrams, Carruthers) **Penalty Increases**, introduced 11.9.20. The bill increases penalties for certain assault, vandalism, and riot offenses. The bill creates a new riot assault charge if a person engaged in an aggravated riot recklessly causes physical harm, an F5 (F4 if the assault is against a peace officer and F3 if the peace officer sustains serious physical harm). The bill allows peace officers to bring civil suits against persons participating in a riot.

• The Senate Republican Caucus unanimously elected Sen. Huffman (R-Lima) as the chamber's president for the 134th General Assembly; Sen. Hottinger (R-Newark) will serve as president pro tempore; Sen. Schuring (R-Canton) will serve as majority floor leader; and Sen. McColley (R-Napoleon) will serve as majority whip.

• Municipalities do not qualify as victims under the **Marsy's Law** constitutional amendment, the Ohio Supreme Court in <u>Centerville v. Knab</u>, 11.12.20 (Slip Opinion No. 2020-Ohio-5219). The case stems from an incident in which Mr. Knab, a schizophrenic and methamphetamine user, called 911 because he hallucinated an active shooter targeting his home. Mr. Knab was convicted of making a false report and of improper use of 911. Mr. Knab was ordered to pay \$1,375.56 in restitution to the city. The Court found that a municipality has no right to restitution under Marsy's Law.

• On 8.31.20, the Sentencing Commission's Ad Hoc Committee on a **Uniform Sentencing Entry** produced its <u>report with recommendations</u>.

• Ohio is allocating \$50 million of its share of the federal Coronavirus Relief Fund to 47 Community Action Agencies for **eviction relief**. Ohioans who are behind on rent, mortgage, and water and/or sewer utility bills (dating back to 4.1.20) can apply for assistance. Ohioans can <u>apply</u> starting 11.2.20; the program ends on 12.30.20.

• The <u>6th Annual Veterans Summit</u>, "Lean Forward: Answering the Call of Veterans in Crisis," is an online event on 11.19.20. The event is free (6.25 hours CLE pending). Register <u>online</u>.

• <u>State ex rel. Fraley v. Ohio Dept. of Rehab. & Corr.</u> (Slip Opinion No. 2020-Ohio-4410), decided 9.15.20, holds that if a sentencing entry does not specify that a firearm specification is to run consecutively to another firearm specification, then ODRC is required to treat the specifications as concurrent. To conform to *Fraley*, <u>ODRC has begun the process of reviewing inmate sentences</u> and is contacting sentencing judges to clarify **whether a specification is to be served concurrently or consecutively**. *ODRC is asking that judges reply quickly to any requests for a nunc pro tunc entries, within 21 days of receipt*.
