Legislative News: Two-Week Review

- The following are some of the bills the Legislature voted out on 12.18.24: HB 37 (Reps. Johnson, Miller K.) alters penalties for OVI; SB 63 (Sen. Lang) changes filing procedure for asbestos cases; SB 158 (Sen. Cirino) adds a judge in Adams County; SB 237 (Sens. Gavarone, Manning) creates an expedited procedure to dismiss defamation claims in conflict with constitutional rights, clarifies the types of cases that can be brought in small claims court, and prohibits naming a minor as a party in an eviction case; HB 497 (Reps. Klopfenstein, Stewart) includes a clarification that restitution and fines imposed upon transferring a juvenile case to another county are not final appealable orders; HB 531 (Reps. Lear, Lorenz) prohibits sexual extortion and authorizes access to digital assets of a deceased minor. Enactment summaries will be available soon on our website.
- The following are some of the bills the Governors signed on 12.19.24: HB 5 (Reps. Baker, Ray) modernizes adoption; SB 100 (Sens. Antonio, Manning) prohibits using a tracking device without a person's knowledge; HB 111 (Reps. LaRe, Miller K.) creates a presumption in favor of prison for F3 domestic violence; HB 234 (Reps. Rogers, Williams) prohibits consideration of genuine remorse upon an Alford plea and makes changes to record sealing and expungement; HB 289 (Reps. Robb Blasdel, Swearingen) makes changes to how time is tolled for SORN registrants and repeals Marsy's Law language concerning procedure for subpoenas of victim records; HB 338 (Reps. Sweeney, White) authorizes child support orders for adult children with developmental disabilities, changes the status of the Lebanon Municipal Court judge, and partially corrects language concerning computerization fee funds. - On 12.4.24, in *State ex rel. Martens v. Findlay Mun. Court*, <u>Slip Opinion No. 2024-Ohio-5667</u>, the Ohio Supreme Court overturned a decision that allowed filing lawsuits despite suffering no injury.
- On 12.9.24, in *State v. Beatty*, <u>Slip Opinion No. 2024-Ohio-5684</u>, the Ohio Supreme Court ruled that state law allows a trial court to impose a **maximum of two consecutive prison terms for firearm specifications.**
- On 12.9.24, in *State v. Grad*, Slip Opinion No. 2024-Ohio-5710, the Ohio Supreme Court ruled that a **significant post-trial change in scientific knowledge** involving key evidence may be considered newly discovered evidence.
- On 12.10.24, in *In re Natl. Prescription Opiate Litigation*, Slip Opinion No. 2024-Ohio-5744, the Ohio Supreme Court ruled that pharmaceutical chains can't be sued as **public nuisances for selling opioids**; such a lawsuit must be brought under the Ohio Product Liability Act.
- The <u>Social Security Fairness Act (H.R. 82)</u> repeals Social Security's **windfall elimination provision** and **government pension offset**. The windfall elimination provision reduces the Social Security benefits of retired federal workers and other public servants who spent a portion of their careers in the private sector. The government pension offset reduces spousal and survivor Social Security benefits in families with retired government workers. <u>H.R.82 passed on 12.20.24</u>.
