Legislative News: Two-Week Review

- Civil stalking victims don't enjoy the same pre-charge protections of crime victims, according to Attorney General Opinion 2024-007, issued 12.23.25. The protection afforded a crime victim by R.C. 2930.07 against disclosure of identifying information applies to case documents associated with criminal or delinquent cases, but in civil matters that is only true in limited circumstances. A clerk of court's duty to redact a victim's information from all records relating to a civil protection order is triggered only when the order is violated, but the redaction requirement for a violation of a protection order, an offense of violence, or a sexually oriented offense applies automatically when the matter is filed with the clerk of courts and without any request by the victim.
- The <u>Social Security Fairness Act (H.R. 82)</u> repeals Social Security's **windfall elimination provision** and **government pension offset**. The windfall elimination provision reduces the Social Security benefits of retired federal workers and other public servants who spent a portion of their careers in the private sector. The government pension offset reduces spousal and survivor Social Security benefits in families with retired government workers. <u>H.R.82 passed on 12.20.24</u>. The bill became effective on 1.5.25 (immediately upon signing by President Biden). The benefits hike under the new law would be retroactive to December 2023. Beneficiaries don't need to take any action to receive the enhanced payments other than verifying that the agency has their current mailing address and direct deposit information.
